At The City Hall, Cardiff

Monday 8th May - Wednesday 10th May 2006

Following the success of Wales' 1st International Autism Conference in May 2004, Autism Cymru will be heading back to Cardiff City Hall for Wales' 2nd International Autism Conference in 2006.

Once again the conference will bring together internationally renowned researchers, practitioners and individuals with autistic spectrum disorders to share their insights and experiences in order to improve understanding and practice.

Wales' 2nd International Autism Conference will commence in style with a drinks reception in the exquisite Marble Hall at Cardiff City Hall. Drinks and a light buffet will be available on arrival, with traditional Welsh music to accompany. This will be followed by an official opening, welcome speeches and two twilight lectures delivered by Donna Williams (tbc) and Dame Steve Shirley.

The following two days will involve an intensive conference programme, featuring an array of respected and outstanding speakers including Professor David Allen (Wales); Professor Michael Fitzgerald (Ireland); Professor Simon Baron Cohen (England); Dr Tony Attwood (Australia); Professor Patricia Howlin (England); Professor Phil Reed (Wales); Dr Glenys Jones (England); Donna Williams (Australia); Professor Ina van Bercklear Onnes (Holland); Tanya Breen (New Zealand); and Dame Stephanie Shirley (England), who will be discussing topical issues arising from current perspectives of research, theory and practice.

Delegates will have the opportunity to take part in a series of 'Good Autism Practice' workshops and will be able to browse around the various exhibitor stalls that will be located in the lower hall.

The registration fee includes admission to lectures, workshops and exhibitions, it also includes admission to a low key social event arranged especially for delegates on the Tuesday evening.

Financial Help : Autism Cymru has established a small bursary scheme to fund parents or people with ASD themselves, who genuinely cannot find the money to meet full costs, to attend training courses across Wales approved by Autism Cymru.

Bursaries for training are awarded on an individual basis and any award made will be based upon evidence of need and financial hardship. Applications should be made in writing and sent to The Hon Treasurer, Autism Cymru Conference Office, 64 Newport Rd, Cardiff, CF24 0DF. Awards are given according to priority and are dependent on the availability of funds being available for the bursary scheme. Awards may be made on a part or full cost basis.
